The Color Guard had a request to participate in the Memorial Service for the 16th Armor Division's 59th reunion. The Guard posted the colors for the opening of the Memorial Service and was retrieved at the end. It was a very nice ceremony much like ours for Post Everlasting. They requested the use of our bell, which was struck for every name read. That was thirty-five names for the past year. There was close to that many people in the meeting room including spouses or adult children. Next year the Division's 60th reunion will be their last.

The spokesperson for the service recounted how the Division liberated Pilsen, Czechoslovakia. And, how grateful the people were freed from the Germans. About fifty years later the City dignitaries invited all who could attend to honor these veterans for their service. To this day the people of Pilsen still love these guys. I received a phone call a few days ago from Peggy Castle who also participated in the service. She passed on to me how really impressed everyone from the Division was with our Color Guard. Not only did the Guard look sharp, but also performed beautifully. I would like to thank our Sergeant of the Guard Larry Bryant, Jack Border, John Cruz, and Frank Mangone for a job well done.

Another Labor Day has come and gone. The day started out a little drizzly, but by noon it was a pretty nice day. Our usual crew that did preparation of the food was there bright and early in the morning. John Super did a great job with the chickens like he always does. We had some tasty side dishes and desserts thanks to the ladies. This year we kept track of how many came to the picnic and it was about 200 people including the kids. It was a pretty decent turnout. On September 17th the Post had a dinner and ceremony to recognize the POW's & MIA's going back to WWI. The oldest remains recovered were those of a marine sergeant from the first battle of WWI the U.S. was involved in. More recently starting with Desert Storm we have no MIA's to report. Our military has gone to extraordinary lengths to recover those that have fallen in combat. We have had very few POW's during the current action with all returned but one as of now.

Nick Brescia read the names of about ten Downers Grove men who were POW's from WWII and Korea. Woody Kawaters presented some facts on the total number of POW's and MIA's from all of the wars, which was well over 87,000 men. That's more than double the population of Downers Grove, which is 48,164.

We had some honored guests that attended our POW/MIA dinner. There were about 60 members of the 504th MP Battalion Association that joined us courtesy Of Bob Cormack who's one of our long time members. Among the 504th was Marion Nichalson who's a WWII Vet, and is their oldest member. Marion also had the distinction of guarding Lt. Colonel Dwight D. Eisenhower the first battalion commander of the 504th.

The Vets came from Hines Saturday as planned. In spite of the rainy weather they insisted to stay outside in the pavilion. One of the fellows told me that after being cooped up in the hospital for days on end it was great to be outside, and view our beautiful grounds. The food was really good the Legion Riders did a wonderful job, and made the Vets from Hines very happy.

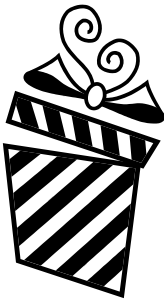

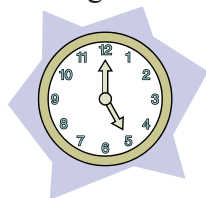

It's Official; DD-214 now available online

The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) has provided a web site for the veterans to gain access to their DD-214 online www.vetrecs.archives.gov. This may be particularly helpful when a veteran needs a copy of his DD-214 for employment purpose or for membership in the American Legion. NPRC is working to make it easier for veterans with computers and internet access to obtain copies of documents for their military files. Veterans and the next of kind of deceased veterans may now use a new online military personnel records system to request documents. Other individuals with a need for document must still complete the Standard Form 180, which can also be downloaded from the online web site. Because the person making the request will be asked to supply all information essential for additional information will be minimized.

The new web-based application was designed to provided better service these requests by elimination the records center's mail room processing time. Pass this information on to former military personnel and their dependents.
