





American Legion Riders – Chapter 80 Update

Legion Riders Join 2012 “Legacy Run” to Indy

Members of Chapter 80 will head to the American Legion National Convention in Indianapolis and attend the Legion Rider Expo, on August 24-26. Registration fees for the ride and the Expo go to fund the American Legion Legacy Scholarship fund. The American Legion Riders, 100,000 members strong from more than 1,350 local posts, ride “For God and Country.”

Purpose of the American Legion Legacy Scholarship fund - As an unfortunate consequence of Operation Iraqi Freedom and the global war on terror, many children of our active-duty military personnel are now members of single-parent families. We are raising funds to ensure that higher education will be a reality for these families. It is estimated that over 11,000 children have lost a parent in the war overseas. That number continues to grow each day. The Legion is actively working to ensure that all those children who want a post-secondary education will be provided one. Each donation goes into the Legacy Scholarship trust fund, which earns interest to be used for scholarships. Currently, the fund's principal is \$5.7 million. In 2012, \$49,950 in aid was distributed to students. The trust fund remains untouched and grows with each donation. Scholarships are funded by the interest, which has awarded \$291,895 in aid since 2004.

Scholarships grow in number and dollar amount each year. The first renewable scholarship was worth \$2,000 and awarded in 2004. Since then the demand has grown steadily with more and more children reaching college age and eligibility. In all, 99 scholarships have been awarded to date by the National Committee on Education. The goal is to raise a principal base of \$20 million which would provide enough money from the interest to fund full college scholarships which could be awarded each year. <http://www.post80.org/>
