

90th Birthday Time Capsule — The Roaring 20's

In May 1921, the Poppy of Flanders Fields became the memorial flower of the Auxiliary and we received the first notice from the Department of Illinois encouraging everyone to wear a crimson poppy on Memorial Day. Our Memorial Day observance included the parade and ceremonies at the cemetery and we invited all of the boys who marched in the parade back to the Legion rooms for ice cream, cake and lemonade.

The year 1922 saw the Gold Star Mothers established and in June, we officially requested an Auxiliary Charter. At our Sept. 19th, meeting the new Charter for Alexander Bradley Burns Unit 80 American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Illinois was read. Membership cards and pins were distributed. Our efforts soon expanded to include the ex-servicemen at Elgin Hospital as well as the children at the Servicemen's Orphans Home in Normal, IL and several hospitalized women veteran's at Oak Park Sanitarium. We baked and delivered a thousand cookies. We donated fund to provide fresh eggs for hospitalized veterans.

By 1926, our membership rose officially to thirty members. We were awarded a loving cup from Dept Convention in recognition of the greatest percentage of membership increase for the year; a 100% gain by May 1st and a 200% gain by August 1st!! The Unit officers have been expanded to include 2nd Vice President, Chaplain, Historian and Hospitalization Chairman. In 1927, we moved to purchase our own American and Auxiliary Parade flags and in 1928, we started sponsorship of the Americanism Essay Scholarship program at Downers Grove schools and in 1929 we finally got our Legion Auxiliary Charter with the signatures of our 27 Charter members framed for display.







Legion Riders Enjoy 2012 “Legacy Run” to Indy

Members of Chapter 80 rode to the American Legion National Convention in Indianapolis and attended the Legion Rider Expo, on August 24-26. The ride and the Expo funded a donation of over \$600,000 to the American Legion Legacy Scholarship fund. We are raising these funds to ensure that higher education will be a reality for the over 11,000 children who lost a parent in the war overseas. That number continues to grow each day.

The Legion is actively working to ensure that all those children who want a post-secondary education will be provided one. The trust fund remains untouched and grows with each donation. Scholarships are funded by the interest, which has awarded \$291,895 in aid since 2004. In all, 99 scholarships have been awarded to date by the National Committee on Education. The goal is to raise a principal base of \$20 million which would provide enough money from the interest to fund full college scholarships which could be awarded each year.





It isn't Easy Being Green...

Checking out at the store, the young cashier suggested to the older woman, that she should bring her own grocery bags because plastic bags weren't good for the environment.

The woman apologized and explained, "We didn't have this *green thing* back in my earlier days."

The young clerk responded, "That's our problem today. Your generation did not care enough to save our environment for future generations."

She was right -- our generation didn't have the *green thing* in its day.

Back then, we returned milk bottles, soda bottles and beer bottles to the store. The store sent them back to the plant to be washed and sterilized and refilled, so it could use the same bottles over and over. So they really were truly recycled.

But we didn't have the *green thing* back in our day.

Grocery stores bagged our groceries in brown paper bags that we reused for numerous things, most memorable besides household garbage bags, was the use of brown paper bags as book covers for our schoolbooks. This was to ensure that public property, (the books provided for our use by the school) was not defaced by our scribbles. Then we were able to personalize our books on the brown paper bags.

But too bad we didn't do the *green thing* back then.

We walked up stairs, because we didn't have an escalator in every store and office building. We walked to the grocery store and didn't climb into a 300-horsepower machine every time we had to go two blocks.

But she was right. We didn't have the *green thing* in our day.

Back then, we washed the baby's diapers because we didn't have the throwaway kind. We dried clothes on a line, not in an energy-gobbling machine burning up 220 volts -- wind and solar power really did dry our clothes back in our early days. Kids got hand-me-down clothes from their brothers or sisters, not always brand-new clothing.

But that young lady is right; we didn't have the *green thing* back in our day.

Back then, we had one TV, or radio, in the house -- not a TV in every room. And the TV had a small screen the size of a handkerchief (remember them?), not a screen the size of the state of Montana. In the kitchen, we blended and stirred by hand because we didn't have electric machines to do everything for us. When we packaged a fragile item to send in the mail, we used wadded up old newspapers to cushion it, not Styrofoam or plastic bubble wrap. Back then, we didn't fire up an engine and burn gasoline just to cut the lawn. We used a push mower that ran on human power. We exercised by working so we didn't need to go to a health club to run on treadmills that operate on electricity.

But she's right; we didn't have the *green thing* back then.

We drank from a fountain when we were thirsty instead of using a cup or a plastic bottle every time we had a drink of water. We refilled writing pens with ink instead of buying a new pen, and we replaced the razor blades in a razor instead of throwing away the whole razor just because the blade got dull.

But we didn't have the *green thing* back then.

Back then, people took the streetcar or a bus and kids rode their bikes to school or walked instead of turning their moms into a 24-hour taxi service. We had one electrical outlet in a room, not an entire bank of sockets to power a dozen appliances. And we didn't need a computerized gadget to receive a signal beamed from satellites 23,000 miles out in space in order to find the nearest burger joint.
