HISTORY returns - picking up in 1963 In 1963 Fred Lester Sr. presented the post a framed set of copies of The United States Constitution in memory of his son Fred Lester Jr., who was a Congressional Medal of Honor recipient of World War II. The framed copies are on display in the hallway of our Post to this day.

Membership reached an all time high of 453 this year and more new members are becoming active at the Post. Snow plowing of the Legion Road became an issue and it was decided to hire Poe Maintenance to do the job.

The Memorial Day Parade had a small altercation before it started. Seems some politicians wanted their cars in the parade. It was made very clear that The American Legion Post 80 has obtained permits from the Village for many years and that this is short memorial service to our fallen comrades and there will be no motor vehicles in our parade. The Parade went on as usual (no vehicles).

In October of 1963 the first NO PARKING signs were placed on Saratoga north of 41st ST.

In February of 1965 the Post began taking pictures of past commanders and auxiliary presidents and made frames for them. The pictures were placed in the main hall and have been added to every year since. Through out the early Sixties all Legion activities were carried out as usual. Many new ideas were presented and tried. Some failed and others were successful.

By June of 1966 the 6.4 acres of land south of the Post Home were again a hot topic. A few years earlier this land was sold to private party. This individual wanted to turn the land into an industrial

development. The Post was against this and contacted the Downers Grove Park Board with it's support for the development of a Park. In a letter to the newly formed Park Board the Legion wrote" we would also be interested in meeting with the Park Board to discuss the development of the entire area to the best interests of the Park Board, the Legion and the Community. As we know this land became Dorhoffer Park.

In 1965 or 66 the Post held it's first Las Vegas Night. This event proved very successful and was continued for many years.

In 1965 a new battle was forming for Post 80. This one although not as lengthy as the one with the Park District. The new apartment complex on the east side of Saratoga. The problem - big trucks using our private road for access to the construction. It seems the trucking company drove where they wanted, on our land. There was damage to Legion property and a suit had to be filled to stop it. We won the suit but there is no mention of the settlement. For the rest of the 60s decade life was running smooth for Post 80. Income from investments, rentals and the bar were slightly more than expenses.

As we enter our 90th year if you have any Post facts to share with us, you may send them to the Post in care of Dave Wisbrock or the Post Museum. Work has begun on an anniversary booklet to be made available to the membership in the fall of 2009. Thanks to Shirley Wrenn for her donation of news clippings from WW II.

Next time a little more on the 60s then into the 70s.
