## Legion Honey Sold Out in 4 Days!

Honey was harvested from 2 of the 3 beehives located on the Post property for the purpose of providing a \$500 scholarship award to a Downers Grove North student having the best essay on the environment. The first harvest yielded 61 pounds of honey from 2 beehives for a requested donation of \$10 per 1-pound jar to offset the cost of the scholarship and beekeeping supplies.

Dick Rooney, the head beekeeper, started a beehive 2 years ago with the scholarship idea in mind to be sustained by donations received for the processed honey. Since then, he added 2 more beehives, all of which are maintained with the help of fellow beekeepers Ed Ludwig and John Super.

Environmental Scholarship essays were anonymously submitted and judged by the Beekeepers. Dick Rooney awarded the first scholarship to Ms. Dana Rotz at the Downers Grove Awards night in May (Note the bees were in arrears at the time of the award and were encouraged to work a little harder).

Pictured above is one of our active beehives consisting of 3 “boxes”. The lower 2 are Brood Boxes where the queen resides to continually lay eggs to create new bees to sustain and grow the hive. The upper box is called a Super, where the bulk of the honey the bees make is stored. As a Super is filled, we add another (and eventually another 1 or 2). The Supers contain the honey we harvest for the Environmental Scholarship.



We look forward to an even better harvest next year. Thank you to all of those who donated.

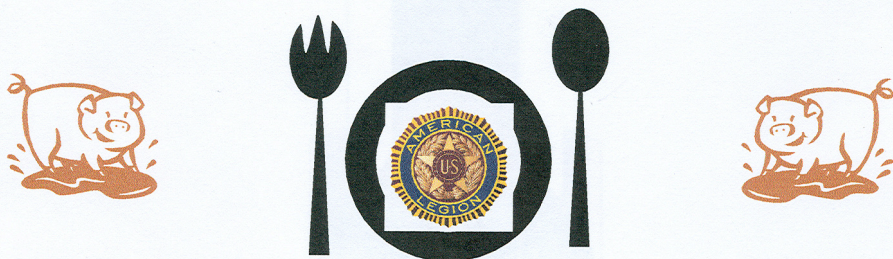
